4. BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

4.1 Welcome to New Members

The Committee welcomed Dale McIver and Lisa-Marie Burgoyne as new members to the Tourism, Events and Promotions Committee.

4.2 Committee Membership

Manager Community and Cultural Development informed the Committee that Brendan Heenan's membership as a general member will be expiring soon and this position will need to be advertised.

4.3 TEP Budget (Standing Item)

Manager Community and Cultural Development advised that the remaining budget for this Committee is \$49,085.39 for FY 2020/21.

4.4 2021 NAIDOC Night Market

Council officers explored the feasibility of a night market in July in collaboration with NAIDOC week and proposed to have it on Thursday 8 July or Friday 9 July from 5pm to 8pm.

If the Committee would like to go ahead with this proposal, Council officers requested a budget of \$5,000 to run this night market.

ACTION:

Council Officers to request assistance from the NAIDOC Committee to liaise with Aboriginal organisations and businesses to attend the night market.

4.5 CBD 'Welcome' Banners

The new 'Welcome' banners have been ordered and are up on the poles around the CBD.

Councillor Satour informed Council officers that some Christmas banners may still be hanging up on the pole in front of Commonwealth Bank.

4.6 Future of Community Events Funding

This item was raised at the last meeting about how NT Government restructured the event funding and community arts festival environment. Community arts organisations and events in Central Australia are at risk of losing their events with this change in the funding setting.

There was a previous recommendation to write a letter to relevant NT Ministers about the impact around the new event funding restructure/guidelines. The Committee discussed further the key things they would like to communicate in the letter.

Discussion ensued about drafting a generic letter to the relevant NT Ministers to highlight the impact of the funding restructure to the arts community in Central Australia

Ali Copley advised Red Hot Arts has written a letter to the Chief Minister, Minister for Arts and Minister for Tourism, explaining the impact of the decision NT Government made about events funding restructure.

ACTION:

Manager Community and Cultural Development to draft a letter from Council to the relevant NT Ministers to reconsider funding for Central Australia to ensure that community arts events and festival, which are a major part of our economic profile, is supported post COVID.

6. OTHER BUSINESS

6.1 Sponsorship Application – NT Writers Centre

NT Writers Centre is requesting \$15,000 from Council to assist in the running of the NT Writer's Festival from 26 to 29 August 2021 at the Olive Pink Botanic Garden and other venues.

The Committee considered the application and agreed to support the application to the value of \$7,500.

That Council support the application from NT Writers Centre to the value of \$7,500 (exc. GST) towards the 2021 NT Writers Festival.

6.2 Sponsorship Application – Wide Open Space

Councillor Cocking having declared an interest in Item 6.2, left the Arunta room at 4:22pm prior to discussion of this matter. Councillor Satour took over the position of Chair.

The sponsorship request is for \$4,500 to assist in the running of the Wide Open Space music, arts and cultural festival, to be held from 30 April to 2 May 2021 in the East MacDonnell Ranges and Ross River Resort.

Discussion ensued about the application in terms of the benefits the event will contribute to the Alice Springs community.

The existing Council sponsorship policy states that organisations based outside the municipality boundaries of Alice Springs are ineligible, unless the demonstrated benefits are primarily for the Alice Springs community.

That Council support the application from Wide Open Space to the value of \$2,250 (exc. GST) towards the Wide Open Space Festival to be held from 30 April to 2 May 2021.

6.3 Sponsorship Application – Easter in the Alice - MTB Race

The 2021 AusCycling Off Road National Cup is a year-long national Mountain Bike competition with race rounds hosted in various locations throughout Australia.

AusCycling intends for one round to be hosted by the Central Australian Rough Riders (CARR) in Alice Springs on 2 April 2021 and seeks the support of Alice Springs Town Council to the value of \$5,000 to assist in delivering the Easter in the Alice – MTB Race event.

The Committee discussed the viability of the proposal, considered the application and agreed to support it at a lesser amount.

Councillor Paterson requested that it be noted that he is in favour of supporting the application to the value of \$5,000.

The Committee raised the issue that some of the applications do not provide comprehensive information on their budget.

Manager Community and Cultural Development advised that Council will be running an Events Management Workshop in March and looking at producing an Events Guide that could be used by the community when applying for sponsorship.

Council officers to invite AusCycling to attend the Events Management Workshop in March.

That Council support the application from AusCycling to the value of \$1,500 (exc. GST) towards the Easter in the Alice – MTB Race in April 2021.

Music NT Inc is requesting \$10,000 for the 2021 Bush Bands Bash annual concert at the Telegraph Station to be held on 12 September.

Council is looking at creating an Alice Springs specific External Events Guide by the end of this financial year, to assist local organisations and new event planners to plan their event. In conjunction with this, Council's Community Projects and Events Officer will be running an Event Management and Planning Workshop on 25 March 2021. The workshop will advise organisations about the correct processes, what permits are available, what funding is available, how to run an application form, etc.

The Department of Health will be present at the workshop to provide information on COVID-19 and events.
